




Italy is the 6th most populated country in Europe




The Main Facts

- Italy total area is 301,340 km² making it the 10th biggest country in Europe, and 73rd in the world
- 76.8% of Italy is covered by mountains
- Only 1.7% of Italy is <u>made of water</u> (lakes, rivers, swamps)
- Italy has 7,600 km of coastline ranking 15th in the world after Mexico and before India
- There are more than 1000 rivers in Italy.
- There are two main mountain ranges in Italy: the Alps and the Apennines.

THE SEAS & COUNTRIES BORDERING ITALY




