


## South America!

Enquiry Question: How does South America's Position Help with Trading?


South America is located in the northern and southern hemispheres and is the fourth largest continent in the world and the fourth most populated continent.

## Key Vocabulary

Prime Meridian Line/ Greenwich  Meridian	The imaginary north-south line through Greenwich is called the Prime Meridian Line and it's used as the basis for our time zone system.
Internation Date Line	The international date line, established in 1884, passes through the mid- Pacific Ocean and roughly follows a 180 degrees longitude north-south line on the Earth. It is located halfway around the world from the prime meridian.
Longitude	We use lines of <b>longitude</b> to find out how far <b>east</b> or <b>west</b> a place is.  These lines run from the top of the Earth to the bottom.
Latitude	We use lines of <b>latitude</b> to find out how far <b>north</b> or <b>south</b> a place is.  These lines run from the parallel to the equator.
Climate	Climate is the general weather over a long period. This can include rainfall, temperature, snow or any other weather condition.
Biodiverse	The variety of plant and animal life in the world.
Import	Bring (goods or services) into a country from abroad for sale.
Export	Send (goods or services) to another country for sale.
Biomes	Large-scale ecosystems of the world with similar climates (weather, temperature), animals and plants.
