PUPIL PREMIUM

Mr Glover is our Pupil Premium Manager. Part of Mr Glover's role is liaising with parents. He is the contact for Service families. The Pupil Premium team includes Miss Dornan, Miss Collett, Mrs Reynolds and Mrs. Woods. Their aim is to identify and work with children that we think would benefit from a little extra help in school, whether this is in the form of assistance with their school work, support with anything that may be troubling them or to provide a person who they know they can turn to if they need to talk. It is envisaged that the team will provide additional opportunities for all the children within the targeted groups during the school year though some will have more contact with them than others. The role of the team is to help the children be happy, confident and successful learners

What is Parent View?

Parent View is an online questionnaire for parents and carers to share their views about their child's school with Ofsted. It was launched in October 2011. Since January 2012, Ofsted has used the information collected through the questionnaire to make decisions about which schools to inspect and when. Inspectors look at Parent View results alongside the traditional paper-based school questionnaires at the point of inspection.

The DfE (Department for Education) specifies that a child by the end of Reception should achieve a "Good Level of Development." This means that a typical child should achieve the Expected Level in all Prime Areas of Learning as well as in the Literacy and Mathematics Specific Areas of Learning. At St Michael's in 2014, **76%** of children leaving Reception achieved this good level of development compared with 59% of pupils in Cornwall.
