Day to Day Info

Unattended children arriving before 8.30am, will be taken to Breakfast Club and charged.

Doors open from 8:40am. Children must be in class to register by 8:50am.

Most classes begin the day with a short wake and shake.

Breaktime is between **10:40am** and **10:55am**. Free fruit is provided to infant children. Milk is provided free to children in Reception. Junior children must bring a healthy snack (no crisps or chocolate). Junior children may purchase milk through the CoolMilk scheme.

Lunchtime is between **11:55am** and **12:55pm**. The school provides a hot meal service. Meals are free to children in the infants. Children may elect to bring a packed lunch.

All classes take part in the Daily Mile each day.

Every class has a traditional story time at 3pm.

School ends at 3:20pm.





The digital reading diary that grows with your child

Using BoomReader means no log is ever lost or wasted. Your child's record builds over time and provides a full, meaningful picture of their reading all the way through school.









Renaissance Accelerated Reader Bookfinder

Look up books yourself at home, to see if they fall within your child's ZPD level.

Your child is assessed at least once a term using Star Reader.

In the test, they answer comprehension-based questions, which get progressively more challenging.


Their score gives them a reading zone (ZPD). This is matched to their word reading and comprehension ability.

Your child is encouraged to quiz on each book, after they have read it. They can do this at home, or in school.

They can then record what they enjoyed about the book on BoomReader!

Reading at Home

It is expected that your child should read for **20 minutes** every day. This might be part of a book/a chapter and could also encompass you sharing a book on some days.



Reading at Home KS2 What reading looks like



<u>Rapid Catch-Up Programme</u>: for children that have not completed the KS1 phonics programme. 2.5 x weekly phonics lessons + 2.5 x weekly reading practice lessons. Books go home at the end of each week, to be read at home the following week.

Fluency Programme: for children that have completed the KS1 phonics programme.

2 – 3 x weekly reading practice sessions, using the fluency chapter books. Books go home every fortnight, to be read at home for the following fortnight. 1 chapter 3 x week.

Accelerated Reader (AR): for children that have completed the Fluency Programme and are reading 120+ words per minute (WPM). Your child will be assessed, and they will be assigned a Zone of Proximal Development (ZPD) number. Your child will choose a book matched to their AR ZPD. Your child is encouraged to **quiz on their book at home**, by accessing the AR website. If they do not have access at home, then there will be an opportunity to quiz at school. This will be **closely monitored**.

The School Libraries

We are very fortunate to have two wonderful library spaces at St Michael's, as well as a multitude of book spaces spread across both key stages. These are being constantly updated with new and exciting texts. We encourage our children to borrow books from these areas to share at home.

Maths

At St Michael's we understand the importance of fluency and how a strong grasp of number and times table knowledge can support the working memory.

In EYFS and KS1, children will be engaging with Mastering Number daily fluency sessions and there will be more information regarding this and how you can support this at home as the year progresses.

The tool we use for practicing our understanding of number and tables knowledge in KS2 is **Time Table Rock Stars.** Below you will find links to instructions on how to access and use.

Year 4 Multiplication Check



- Between Monday 3rd June and Friday 14th June, your child will take part in a statutory multiplication tables check.
- The purpose of the check is to determine whether your child can fluently recall their times tables up to 12, which is essential for future success in mathematics. It will also help us, as a school, to identify pupils who may need additional support.
- The test is an on-screen check consisting of 25 times tables questions. Your child will answer 3 practise questions before moving on to the official check and will then have 6 seconds to answer each question. On average, the check should take no longer than 5 minutes to complete.

<u>Create a challenge</u> Make it fun by turning times table practise into a competition or challenge for your child, by timing them and keeping a record of their scores. You could even join in yourself and set a challenge to learn a more difficult times table, such as the 13 times table and get your child to test you at the end of the week in exchange for testing them...

Practise tables as a time-

filler When you're sitting at traffic lights or waiting in the doctor's surgery it is the perfect opportunity for a bit of times table practise! It's always better to just spend a few minutes reciting or testing times tables rather than going into overdrive and spending too long practising them.



<u>Rhymes and songs</u> Silly rhymes and songs can help children to remember these patterns, e.g. '0 2 4 6 8, my mum thinks I'm great' – the sillier the better really!



Help them with the ones they find tricky

There are usually one or two multiplication facts in each times table that are more difficult. When you notice that your child is stumbling over the same fact each time, try to give them extra practise. You could even get your child to write the fact out in a fun way on a piece of card and then stick it somewhere prominent (like on the fridge) so that

fridge) so that they have an extra reminder!

Games

Many games, such as Bingo, Snap and Pairs, can be adapted to focus on tables. They make great short, quick-fire games that can be fitted in any time of the day.



<u>Make it real</u> The danger with too much rote learning of times tables is that children can fail to see the use of times tables in real life. Try to take opportunities to get your child to use multiplication in problem solving, for example working out quantities for scaling up a <u>recipe, or</u> calculating the price of more than one item of shopping.
