Summary of Spending 2016/17

Statement of Intent:

To improve the quality and breadth of PE and Sports Provision, including increasing participation in PE and sport so that all children develop healthy lifestyles and reach the performance levels they are capable of.

Ambitions:

- 2. To ensure that all pupils have access to a broad, inclusive and progressive PE curriuculum
- 3. To buy and purchase purposeful sport equipment
- 4. Promote outside clubs
- 5. Increase cross country participation
- 6. To improve pupil participation within an enhanced, extended and inclusive extra-curricuar programme
- 7. To ensure that young people benefit of health related benefits of engaging regularly in sustained physical activity.

Impact of Funding for Academic year 2016-2017

The profile of PE has been increased across the MAT which promotes the benefits of physical activities for pupils and move them towards a healthy, active lifestyle. This has been achieved by using notice boards being used, more information on newsletters and websites and pupils being involved in more competition.

Employing Kernow sports to help deliver a broad, enriched PE curriculum.

Enrichment clubs providing a variety of sports clubs to all children from 1-6 to access.

Part of the school cluster groups, sharing of CPD and allowing children to participate in inter house competitions across the cluster.

Sports tracker ensures that children who are not accessing PE are targeted and participate.
