Day to Day Info

Unattended children arriving before 8.30am, will be taken to Breakfast Club and charged.

Doors open from 8:45am. Children must be in class to register by 8:55am.

Most classes begin the day with a short wake and shake.

Breaktime is between 10:30 and 10:45 . Free fruit is provided to infant children. Milk is provided free to children in Reception. Junior children must bring a healthy snack (no crisps or chocolate). Junior children may purchase milk through the CoolMilk scheme.

Lunchtime is between **11:55am** and **12:55pm**. The school provides a hot meal service. Meals are free to children in the infants.

Children may elect to bring a packed lunch.

All classes take part in the Daily Mile each day.

Every class has a traditional story time at 3pm.

School ends at 3:15pm.

A typical school week equates to 32.5 hours.



For home reading, your child will be assessed on AR, and they will be assigned a Zone of Proximal Development (ZPD) number. Your child will choose a book matched to their AR ZPD. Your child is encouraged to quiz on their book at home, by accessing the AR website. If they do not have access at home, then there will be an opportunity to quiz at school.

We will be returning to <u>paper reading diaries</u> this year. For children on the Phonics and Fluency programmes, we request that an adult listens to them and records their reading daily. For children on the AR programme, we encourage them to take ownership and record their own reading in their diaries.





We do not want to limit children to the books that are in the baskets at school and encourage them to read as widely as possible. Look up books yourself at home, to see if they fall within your child's ZPD level.

Your child is assessed at least once a term using Star Reader.

In the test, they answer comprehension-based questions, which get progressively more challenging.

Their score gives them a reading zone (ZPD). This is matched to their word reading and comprehension ability.

Your child is encouraged to quiz on each book, after they have read it. They can do this at home, or in school.

They can then record what they enjoyed about the book on BoomReader!

The School Libraries and Beyond

We are very fortunate to have two wonderful library spaces at St Michael's, as well as a multitude of book spaces spread across both key stages. These are being constantly updated with new and exciting texts.

We also encourage the children to access a range of different texts, to develop their reading for pleasure interests and ask that you support them with this, where possible, outside of










Donations of **quality** and **up to date** novels, non-fiction texts, recipe books, magazines, comics etc, are always welcomed at school.

Please record in their reading diary at least 3 x a week.





What is Spelling Shed?

- Research has shown that learning to spell is much more than just memorising a list of words.
- Children that learn the skills of our language are much more effective spellers.
- Spelling Shed helps children develop their language skills, so they learn HOW to spell, not just a list of words.


1 x assignment per week set by the class teacher. This will be reinforcing the week's spelling rule they have completed in class.

The children should enjoy and access all other games.


However, Mastery Zone is the AI-driven EdShed tool that is completely personalised to each child's spelling need. It constantly assesses their play in accuracy in speed to ensure they have mastered each word. They should use this feature frequently to build confidence and competence in spelling, plugging any gaps in their knowledge.

Maths

At St Michael's we understand the importance of fluency and how a strong grasp of number and times table knowledge can support the working memory.

Maths – White Rose Maths
